The Goal of the Internet 101 for Law Makers Project is to train atleast Law Makers on;

- 1. Video Telephony and Online Chats, with prerequisite of Gmail for those who do not have an email address.
- 2. IG Awareness and Principles so that they can Advocate for a secure and trustworthy internet.
